

A note from Miss Wilde

Hello everyone! Year 1/2 have made an absolutely fantastic start to the new school year and are working extremely hard each day. I have been blown away with the children's positive attitude and enthusiasm towards their work so early in the year and am so excited for a productive first term ☺ I am looking forward to sharing our amazing achievements this term via class dojo and would like to thank you for all of your continued support!

English

In year 1/2, we will be starting our term focusing on books by the same author. We will be exploring the life of Roald Dahl as our author and reading a selection of his stories. The children will learn about Roald Dahl's life and what inspired him while also retelling his stories, describing the characters and finally writing their own magical story. We will also be exploring poetry within his stories with a special focus on rhyming word.

We are reading...

We will also be reading 'Mr Majeika' as our class read.

Maths

In maths we will be starting the autumn term focusing on place value. We will use practical equipment to represent numbers in different ways and partition numbers using tens and ones. We will then be moving onto addition and subtraction. Children will find 10 more and 10 less and add/subtract 2-digit numbers. Finally finishing the term focusing on money. Children will count money and find totals.

Note to parents:

Children will bring home a username and password to access 'Times Table Rock stars' this half term. Children will practice their 2, 5, and 10 times tables.

Science

Our autumn topic is focused on animals, including humans.

'Why are humans not like animals?'

Children will identify and label parts of the body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense. Identify and name common animals that are birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles, mammals. Also name a variety of animals that are herbivores, carnivores and omnivores and describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

Geography

This term we will be exploring different ways we map the world. Focusing on globes, maps, satellites and compasses. Using these the children will identify the North Pole, South Pole, axis, equator, northern hemisphere, and southern hemisphere. The children will also use an atlas to find the: United Kingdom, five oceans, seven continents and location of the school. Children will also be exploring the continents and oceans. Labelling these on a map and ordering the largest to the smallest. Also the children will be exploring the four countries making up the UK.

History

The Gunpowder Plot

Children will begin history this term focusing on the key events from the gunpowder plot and why it was such a significant part of history. They will also explore how this is remembered today.

Black Plague

Children will learn about how the disease spread and its devastating effects on society. Children will also explore how it spread so quickly and how it ended.

Jethro Tull

Children will also focus on Jethro Tull and his invention of the seed drill. Children will understand how this invention benefited farming.

Other curriculum information:

- **Skills Builder:** This term, children will be focusing on improving our listening and team working skills. We will start on step 1 and build up to step 3.
- **Art/DT:** In art this term we will be focusing on self-portraits and building on our skills of sculpture using clay. In DT, we will be designing and constructing Christmas stockings.
- **Computing:** This term there is a focus on recognising the different parts of computer and improving the children's mouse skills.
- **PSHE:** We will develop our knowledge of our relationships focused on feelings in PSHE. In our anti-bullying lessons, we will take a look how to use the internet safely.
- **PE:** Invasion games are the focus for PE for this term! We will be focusing on basketball. Please ensure children come to school in their PE kits every **Thursday**.
- **Music:** Music lessons this term focus on Round and Round, a Bossa Nova Latin style.

Children should try to complete the optional homework sent out fortnightly. Activities set will be linked to work taught in class! Spelling will be given on a Friday and tested the following Friday. These will also be given out fortnightly.
